Interactive Faith Bible Studies

Here are a few facts from the recent "Elijah" study, led by Prof. Keith Wessel:

- It was viewed in at least 33 countries, a number of which are heavily Muslim;
- There were 4000 streams, with some 1300 individual computers logging in;
- 30% of those logging in to this study were first time visitors to the Interactive Faith website.

School of Adult Bible Study (Phase Two)

Marriage Enrichment & Getaway Weekend

No other WELS entity exists to help husbands and wives glorify God in their marriages. Adult Discipleship has for the past decade developed a different biblical marriage enrichment event each year and trained pastors to use it through “on the job training” – congregational leaders participate along with members. In the past two years, we have served members and trained pastors at dozens of events in 9 of our 12 districts. Most have benefited from the event called “Sticky Marriage.” These Friday through Sunday events have helped couples develop habits and practices to keep sticking together by applying the grace of God to their relationship. By conducting these events, the CAD not only serves pastors and wives in their own marriages, but it also provides pastors who attend valuable resources for enriching the marriages in their churches.

We are currently offering two additional enrichment events: “Distracted Marriage” and “Mysterious Marriage.” Events are being scheduled in Omaha, Minneapolis, Austin, Green Lake, WI, San Diego and possibly Phoenix. Women’s Ministry Committee

The materials from www.welswomen.net have been transitioned to www.wels.net/women (on the synod Web site). Resources for women's bible studies and “Advent by Candlelight” are available as free downloads from the site. *Heirs Together* continues to be a strong tool in communicating God's design of head and helper. NPH reports that quantities are getting low and a digital download should be considered soon. A version with fewer and shorter lessons is being worked on as additional class options. The Leadership Conference at the Seminary was attended by over 125 women who studied principles of leadership based on a study of Ezra and Nehemiah. The Congregational Ministries Team continues to network women in the districts who are involved in their congregation's women's ministry programs in order to gather ideas and share information. A monthly mailing goes out to over 1,000 people highlighting updates and resources available through the website. Speakers on women’s ministry are available through the committee to help congregations better serve and be served by the majority of their communicant membership.
